Handel's Messiah: Why do we stand at The Hallelujah Chorus and other stories?

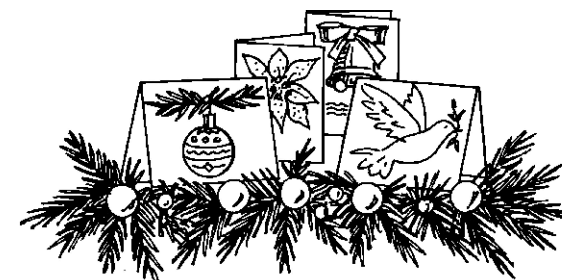
